Fulcrum and Renova donate toys, gift and essential supplies to Christmas appeals across the North West

Owned by healthcare investor Fulcrum, Renova has helped to deliver 17 NHS community health facilities across the North West but also has an active programme of partnerships with local groups and charities to further support the wellbeing of residents. As part of this, Renova has made a series of donations to deserving Christmas appeals including:

- St Helens Christmas Gift Appeal managed by St Helens Borough Council, the Christmas Gift Appeal brings together donations from local residents and business to "help make Christmas special for some of the borough's most disadvantaged children and young people"
- <u>Teardrops Supporting Your Community</u> the charity helps to support homeless and vulnerable people across St Helens, including creating Christmas food hampers for hundreds of families
- <u>Halton Toy Appeal</u> the appeal's mission is to "help disadvantaged children living in and around Halton who wouldn't normally receive a present on Christmas Day", while also supporting families in poverty with food and essentials all year round
